#### Cemetery

Olive Township has two cemeteries—the Olive Township Cemetery, located at the corner of 116<sup>th</sup> and Taylor and the West Olive Cemetery, located just south of Stanton Street on 136<sup>th</sup>. Graves may be purchased by township residents (or landowners), and the cost is:

1 grave - \$150, 2 graves - \$300, 4 graves - \$500

Additional costs apply at the time of burial, and only immediate family members of deed-holders may be buried in the Olive Township Cemetery: parents, spouse, children and/or grandchildren.

## **PA116 Farmland Agreements**

Applications for new agreements should be turned in to the township office by August if possible. If you have bought or sold land that has a PA116 agreement on it, the agreement stays with the land, and paperwork must be filed to transfer the agreement to the new owner. This is done by contacting The Michigan Department of Ag & Rural Development at 517-284-5663. More information about applying, transferring, splitting or releasing land is available at <a href="https://www.michigan.gov/farmland">www.michigan.gov/farmland</a>. PA116 agreements are very restrictive, and should not be entered into without clear planning and advice from your financial planner/accountant.

We will not accept tires, whole cars, paints, oil, or solvents of any kind. The county has drop off points for solvents and paints. We are **not** offering electronics recycling.

## **Cleanup Day**

Our annual cleanup day is scheduled for Saturday, April 22. This is a great opportunity to clean up your property and get rid of junk at little or no cost. Please bring the coupon on this newsletter with you when you drop off your articles. Read the coupon to see what can and cannot be accepted. Township officials will be canvassing the township this year looking for junk, and sending letters about complying with the zoning ordinance to clean up properties.

## **Road Brining**

We anticipate having the township's gravel roads graded and brined three times this coming season. Weather permitting we will apply brine the first of May, midsummer, and in the fall.

#### Road Work

Our road millage brought in approximately \$325,000 in revenue from 2016 taxes that will be used to improve township roads.

These roads will be resurfaced:

- 112<sup>th</sup> Avenue from Tyler to Polk Streets
- Blair Street from 96<sup>th</sup> to 104<sup>th</sup> Avenues
- Croswell Street from 120<sup>th</sup> to 124<sup>th</sup> Avenues

Polk Street will be paved from 120<sup>th</sup> to 124<sup>th</sup> Avenues.

These roads will be re-graveled:

- Blair Street from 128<sup>th</sup> to 136<sup>th</sup> Avenues
- 140<sup>th</sup> Avenue from Tyler to Bagley Streets

## **Getting Ready for Construction Projects?**

We are approaching the Summer construction season. New building projects on your home or farm, a new pole barn or other new structures on your property require a permit from the township prior to construction. Most improvement projects also require a permit from the township. Given this, before you begin any project, be sure to check with the township at least seven days prior to when you wish to begin the project to allow for enough time to receive a permit, if required.

#### Did You Know?

If you are interested in selling part of your property you need to receive approval from the township to divide the land prior to the sale of the property. Inquiring with the township prevents the sale of a parcel that is unbuildable. In addition, we can help ensure structures are appropriately setback from proposed property lines.

#### **Got Junk?**

Olive Township prohibits the outdoor storage of junk or junk vehicles on any property. While we have a lot of open space around us, keeping our property clean keeps the township safe and attractive to its residents and visitors.

## **Assessor's Office Information**

Staff from the Assessor's Office will be out visiting properties again this Spring and Summer. Our goal is to visit each property every five years. We review building measurements, take updated exterior photos, and interview property owners. In 2016 we completed about 180 reviews to get the process underway. We intend to visit about 400 parcels each year hereafter to reach all 2,000 parcels within the five years.

This is the current property type mix by parcel count:

Agricultural 486 24.3% Commercial 75 3.8% Industrial 92 4.6% Residential 1.347 67.3%

## **Fire Department News**

#### **Burn Permits**

If you have a brush pile that you would like to burn, call the township office and they can issue you a permit over the phone. The burn season runs from November 1 to May 31 with provisions from June 1 to October 31. In the off season a \$500 deposit is required and should only be used if you can't wait for the regular burning season. Only brush and wood may be burned.
