2018 Elections

Registered voters who live in Olive Township will have an opportunity to vote several times this year. Here's a list of election dates:

- May 8 School Election for Zeeland and West Ottawa districts
- August 7 State Primary Election (including local millage)
- November 6 State General Election

All elections will be held at the Olive Township Hall at 6480 136th Avenue. To see what is on the ballot, go to https://webapps.sos.state.mi.us/mivote/, type in your information, and click on sample ballot. Polls will be open from 7am – 8pm.

Absentee Ballots

If you would like to vote by absentee ballot, please call the township office at 616-786-9996 or email lona@olivetownship.com and an application will be mailed to you. State law requires absent voting to be a 2-step process. The township is unable to mail you an absentee ballot unless you first submit this application by mail, or drop it by the township office; and then a ballot will be mailed to you.

Filled out absentee ballots can be mailed back with a forever stamp—no extra postage is needed. Don't forget to sign the envelope! Make sure you mail your application and ballot back early enough-the Postal Service suggests allowing 3-5 business days for first class mail. The township hall will also be open from 9 am – 2 pm the Saturday before each election to allow you to vote by absentee ballot.

Permanent Absentee Voter List

If you are over 60 years of age and would like to be placed on a Permanent Absentee Voter list, just call 786-9996 or stop in the office and let us know. Just voting once by absentee ballot does not mean you will be placed on the permanent list—you must make a special request for this. When you request to be on the Permanent Absentee Voter list, you will automatically receive **an application** for every election. You must

submit an application for each election, and then you will receive and be able to vote your ballot.

Election Workers

Applications are being accepted for election workers for the August and November elections. Applicants must be registered voters, and available to work 14-16 hours on election day, which always falls on Tuesdays.

Millage Renewals

At the August 7th election, voters in Olive Township will be asked to vote on two millage renewal proposals. The first is for the Fire Department equipment, and will be levied for four years, if approved. At .75 mill, the millage will cost taxpayers \$.75 per \$1,000 in taxable value. The second is for the Road Fund, and will be levied for four years, if approved. At 2 mills, the millage will cost taxpayers \$2.00 per \$1,000 in taxable value. This money will be used to pave, repave, repair and maintain township roads.

Cleanup Day

Our annual cleanup day is scheduled for Saturday, April 28, **8am to 1pm**. This is a great opportunity to clean up your property and get rid of junk at little or no cost. Please bring the coupon below with you when you drop off your articles. Read the coupon to see what can and cannot be accepted. Students needing community service credits may volunteer by calling the township office.

Reminder--Please wait until 8 am on Saturday to bring your items. No items are to be brought the night before.

Getting Ready for Construction Projects?

We are approaching the Summer construction season. New building projects on your home or farm, a new pole barn or other new structures on your property require a permit from the township prior to construction. Most improvement projects also require a permit from the township. Given this, before you begin any project, be sure to check with the township at least seven days prior to when you wish to begin the project to allow for enough time to receive a permit, if required. Please note that most demolition projects also require a permit.

Did You Know?

If you are interested in selling part of your property you need to receive approval from the township to divide the land prior to the sale of the property. Inquiring with the township prevents the sale of a parcel that is unbuildable. In addition, we can help ensure structures are appropriately setback from proposed property lines.

Got Junk?

Olive Township prohibits the outdoor storage of junk or junk vehicles on any property. While we have a lot of open space around us, keeping our property clean keeps the township safe and attractive to its residents and visitors. We will be canvassing the township looking for junk, and sending letters about cleaning up properties.

Road Brining

We anticipate having the township's gravel roads graded and brined three times this coming season. Weather permitting we will apply brine the middle of May, the middle of June, and the first of September.

Assessor's Office Information

Staff from the Assessor's Office will be out visiting properties again this Spring and Summer. Our goal is to visit each property every five years. We review building measurements, take updated exterior photos, and interview property owners. In 2017 we completed about 400 reviews. We intend to visit about 400 parcels each year hereafter to reach all 2,000 parcels within a five year cycle.

Burn Permits

If you have a brush pile that you would like to burn, call the township office and they can issue you a permit over the phone. The burn season runs from November 1 to May 31 with special provisions from June 1 to October 31. In the off season a \$500 deposit is required and should only be used if you can't wait for the regular burning season. Only brush and wood may be burned.
